




## Question

Will the section of beach that has been restored for a longer period of time contain more surf smelt eggs than the one that has been restored for fewer years?







## **Results and Science Communication**

Claim: The answer to this was no, there was no strong relationship that as the years of restoration increase, the total amount of smurf smelt eggs would increase.



**Claim:** The answer to this was no, there was no strong relationship that as the years of restoration increase, the total amount of smurf smelt eggs would increase.

**Evidence...**We know this because our R<sup>2</sup> value was 0.001, which means our regression line is a bad fit and there is no relationship between the two variables. Our P value was 0.92 which means there was no significant difference between the years.

We don't think we had enough trials to show




